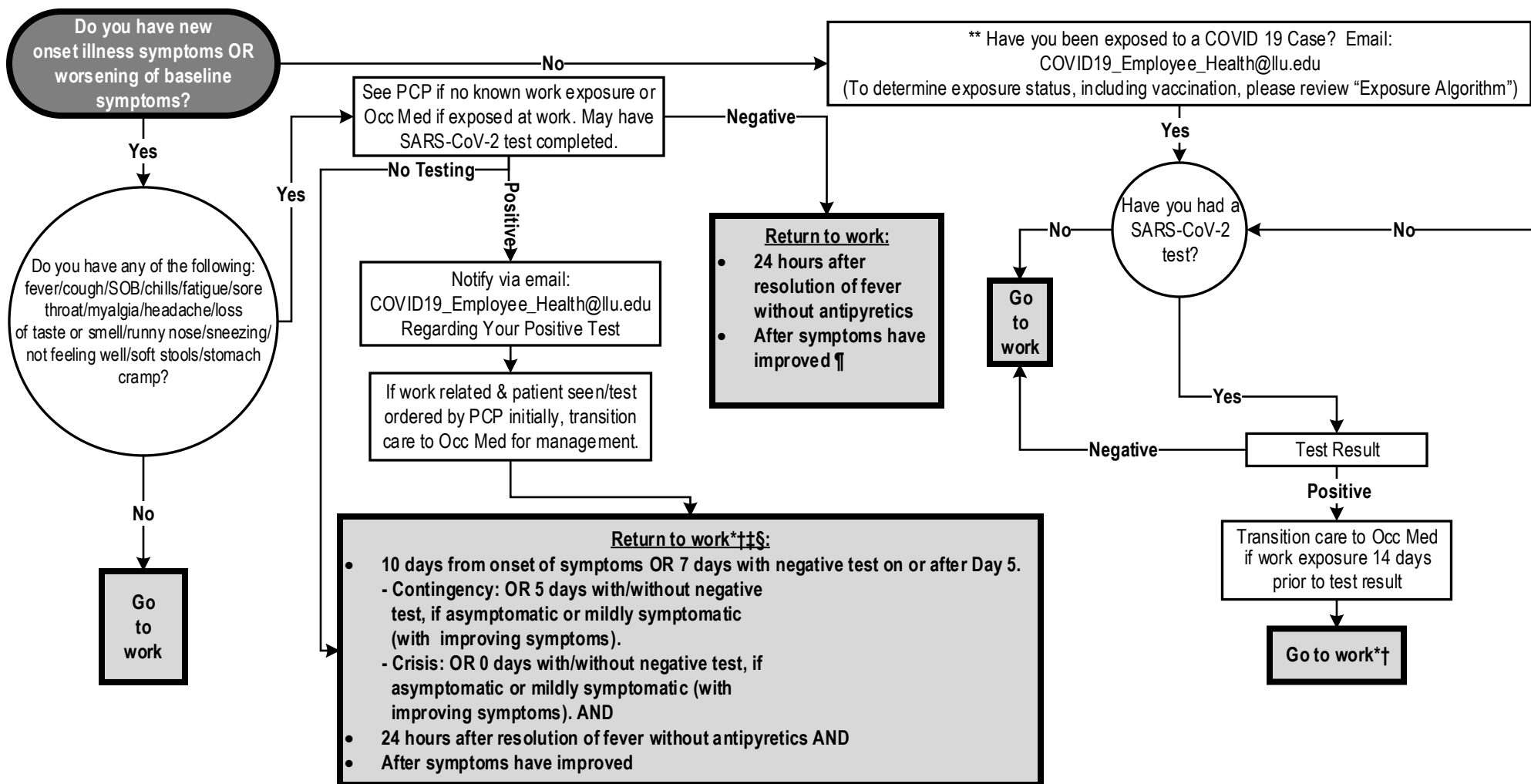


LLUH EMPLOYEE RETURN-TO-WORK CRITERIA (ALL SITES) – UPDATED JANUARY 14, 2022 (vs.1')

SYMPTOMS, EXPOSURES, & TESTING



* If returning to work < 10 days from onset of symptoms (or positive test, if asymptomatic), healthcare personnel working in patient care areas must wear an N95 through day 10.¶

† Non-healthcare personnel that do not work in patient care areas may use a face mask or request a BYD N95 from their supervisor and wear through day 10.

‡ Please note: Maximum protection with an N-95 occurs when fit testing has been performed.

§ Examples of healthcare personnel are those that work in patient care areas and may include nurses, nursing assistants, physicians, technicians, therapists, phlebotomists, pharmacists, students and trainees, contractual staff not employed by the health care facility, and persons not directly involved in patient care, but who could be exposed to infectious agents that can be transmitted in the health care setting (e.g., clerical, dietary, environmental services, laundry, security, engineering and facilities management, administrative, billing, and volunteer personnel).

¶ If symptomatic and have a negative antigen test, it is recommended that you follow-up with a PCR test.
